Plato's Wiki: The Possibility of Digital Dialectic

Nothing brings home C. P. Snow's accusation that "[i]ntellectuals, in particular literary intellectuals, are natural Luddites" more than the resistance of faculty in literature, indeed the whole of humanities, to digital delivery of instruction, hybrid or online, at the graduate level. This article describes a semester-long experiment in digital dialectic that uses one such technology, a class wiki, in a graduate class. Like language itself, a wiki is not a transparent medium of exchange, but one that shapes the conversation, a conversation that has the potential to be dialectical and thereby encourage critical thinking.
